

HOW to properly Authenticate Your Certificate of Live Birth or Naturalization Certificate

Authenticate a birth certificate for use in foreign countries by sending a Request of Authentication Service to the U.S. State Department, along with the original document certified by the Secretary of State from where you were born and the fee.

Authentication Definition:

General: Verification of the genuineness of a document or signature, to make it effective or valid. It usually takes the form of a sealed or stamped certificate that confirms the authority of a public official (such as judge or a notary public) or of a signatory.

A certified birth certificate works for just about any purpose within the borders of the United States. But if you need a birth certificate because you are getting married overseas or have some other legal business in another country, you will need something more, a certificate of authentication or an apostille.

The U.S. Department of State issues both of these documents. Whether you need an

Authentication Certificate or an apostille depends on the country in which the document will be used. You'll need an Authentication Certificate for a birth certificate you intend to use in countries that are not parties to the Hague Apostille Convention. On the other hand, you'll need an Apostille Certificate for use in countries that are parties to the Hague Apostille Convention.

Notice: An "apostille" is a form of authentication issued to documents for use in countries that participate in the Hague Convention of 1961. A list of countries that accept apostilles is provided by the US State Department.
